## **Attendance**

56 children had 100% attendance and no lates during the spring term. They will all receive a Fun City voucher as a reward. Well done to each and every one of them. It is your parental responsibility to ensure that your child attends school **every day** unless they need to see a doctor. If they are feeling a little under the weather, bring them to school and let their teacher know so that we can keep an eye on them. Often they feel fine by playtime. If they get worse, we will ring you. Odd days missed add up to a lot of missed lessons and gaps in learning.

Children receive **13 weeks** allocated school holidays so please book holidays for during this time. Absence reasons such as visiting relatives are not valid reasons for children to miss their education. This is the law and not a school rule. Parents can be taken to court and fined. The local authority has already issued some of our parents with penalty notices for unauthorised absences. We continue to strive for a minimum of **96%** attendance which is the government requirement for all children. At the moment we have 95.06% attendance and each year group is:
